New Business

Ord No. 818: An Ordinance Relating to Municipal Finance, Adding a New Chapter 3.25 to the Scappoose Municipal Code, and Creating the Scappoose City Lien Docket

Council President Bernhard read the open hearing statement.

Council President Bernhard opened the public hearing.

Legal Counsel Cindy Phillips gave a brief overview of Ordinance 818. She explained it gives the City of Scappoose a procedure by which to use the provisions that are already in the Scappoose Municipal Code for placing liens on property. She explained one of the most salient points about this ordinance is the ability if the lien is not paid within 60 days after placing the lien on the lien document. She explained under 3.25.650 it states that if the lien remains unpaid for 60 days after it has been recorded in the city's lien docket, the lien may recorded in county indices and may be foreclosed in any manner provided by law. She explained she understands there has been traditionally a bit of an issue around here in Columbia County and that is properties seem to get sold without anybody ever checking the City lien document. She explained if this ordnance gets enacted this can end up being a lien that is recorded in the County dockets and therefore it will get picked up and it will get paid upon the transfer.

City Manager Hanken explained one of the big issues the City had over the summer was with foreclosed homes and nuisances regarding lawns that were not mowed and this helps resolve that.

Council President Bernhard closed the public hearing at 7:07 pm

Councilor Ingham moved and Councilor Gedlich seconded the motion to approve Ord No. 818: An Ordinance Relating to Municipal Finance, Adding a New Chapter 3.25 to the Scappoose Municipal Code, and Creating the Scappoose City Lien Docket.

Council President Bernhard read the title for the first time.
